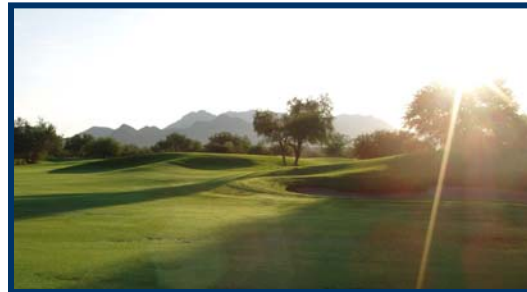

Objective:

To provide a unique learning experience about desert turfgrass management for professional turfgrass managers. The distinctive arid climatic conditions of Southern Arizona afford an opportunity for instruction about warm- and cool-season turfgrass management in desert soils and specialized irrigation practices. Participants will receive a certificate of completion for the desert short course and may apply for GCSAA and other professional continuing education credits.

Overseeding and Transition
Cultural Management Practices

Instructors:

Learn from the faculty and staff of The University of Arizona, providing national and local expertise on all aspects of the turf curriculum. Instructors from multiple disciplines coordinate to present a 'wide-angle view' of the challenges associated with desert turf management.

Format:

The week-long Desert Turf School includes both lecture and field demonstration sessions. The instructional format promotes interaction and dialogue between instructors and students. Classes begin Monday afternoon and continue through Friday morning, allowing for easy out-of-area travel planning. Lunch is provided daily and a welcome reception is scheduled. The registration fee includes class materials, lunches, reception, and refreshments during class breaks. The fee does not include other meals, lodging, travel, or incidentals.

Time and Location:

The 2008 Desert Turf School will be held January 7-11, 2008 at the University of Arizona in Tucson, AZ. Instruction and field demonstrations will be conducted at the Karsten Turfgrass Research Facility.

Accommodations:

A block of rooms has been reserved at the Windmill Suites at St. Phillips Plaza. Within walking distance to classes, the hotel offers suite-style rooms, a free continental breakfast each morning and a business center. Be sure to mention the UA Turf School to get the reduced rate.
